How to get involved:

• Individual A.A. Members

- **Corrections Meeting Chairpersons-** The Corrections Committee invite individual AA Members to put themselves on the Corrections meeting Chairperson 12th Step list to become a Corrections meeting Chairperson. This Chairperson attends and leads a meeting once a week for a one year period. Due to the fact that the jail is segregated, Men and Women are needed to carry out this Twelve-Step project.
- **Corrections Speakers-** A.A. members from all over Rockland County are invited to put themselves on the Corrections Speakers 12th Step list to stand ready to assist the Corrections Meeting Chairpersons to carry out this Vital Twelve-Step work.

- **Time criteria-** It is suggested that all Chairpersons and Speakers are required to have at least one year of continuous sobriety.
- **Sheriff's Department Regulations**
 - You can not have been an inmate at the Rockland County Jail within the past five years. You can not currently be on parole or probation.
 - ***All AA's entering the Correctional facility will be checked out to see if they have any outstanding warrants, and will be detained if they are found to be in violation.***

The area effort- In addition, The Rockland County Corrections Committee Chairpersons, regularly attend the New York Intergroup Corrections Committee meetings and report back to Rockland County Intergroup about programs, policies and upcoming events concerning regional AA correctional issues. We also are contacted by N.Y. Intergroup and are given information to contact inmates that are interested in attending AA meetings in our area after they are released.
